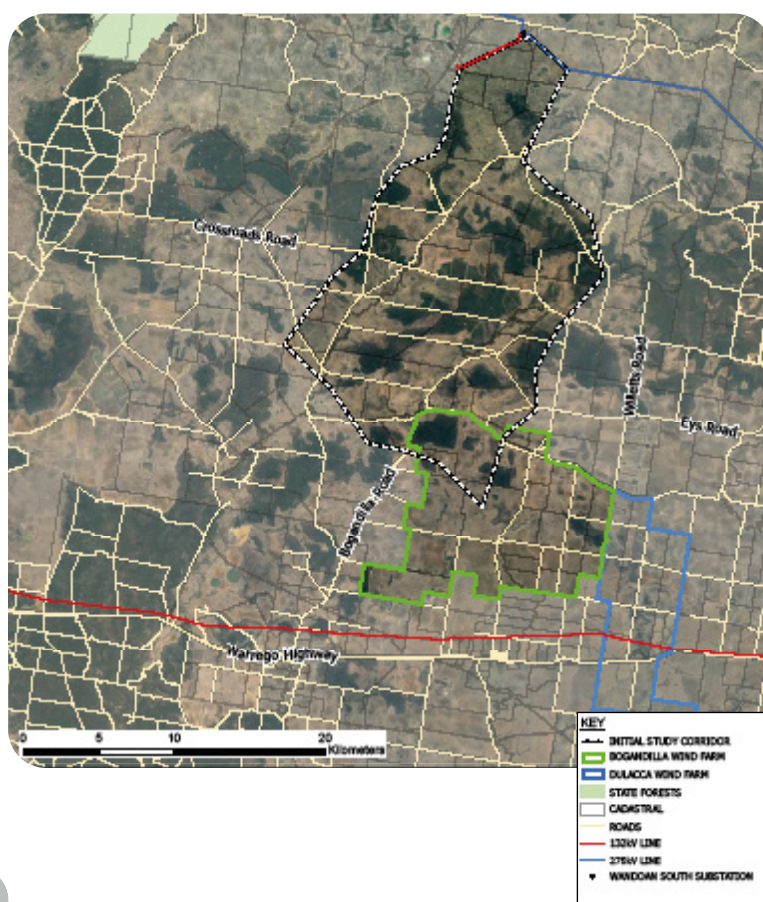
Project overview

RES is progressing the development of the proposed Bogandilla Wind Farm, located approximately 5 km north of Dulacca. The project is indicatively proposed to consist of up to 85 wind turbines across approximately 13,000 hectares of predominantly grazing and cropping land, with a generation capacity of around 580 MW, enough to power more than 290,000 Queensland homes. The project remains in the early development phase, with environmental studies and transmission investigations continuing.

Wind Monitoring Continues

Following the installation of a meteorological mast within the wind farm site boundary in August 2025, wind monitoring activities are on-going across the wind farm project area to further improve our understanding of the local wind resource and support project planning. Collecting long-term wind data is an important step in refining energy production estimates and informing the ongoing development of the project.

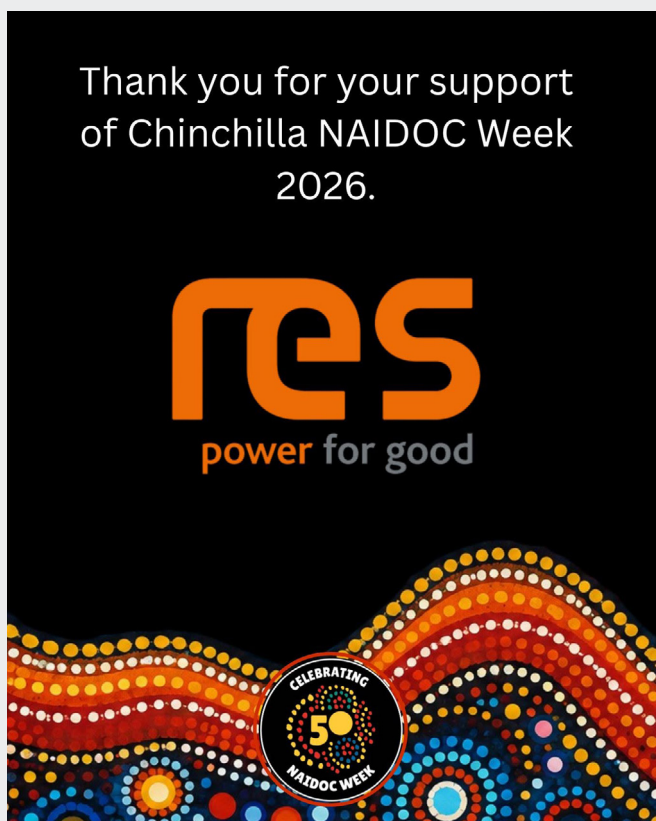
Investigating Transmission Line Options

Studies are continuing to identify and assess potential overhead transmission line alignments connecting the proposed wind farm to the existing electricity network. Current work is focused on refining the study corridor, considering environmental, heritage, technical and planning landholder factors. Consultation with affected landholders and stakeholders will continue as alignment investigations progress.
